- 2. The Ivers Parish Council to identify land for Allotments, should Buckinghamshire Council fail to do so and /or in addition to what is identified by others.


Background

There is a positive obligation to make allotments available should there be demand (Section 23 Small Holdings and Allotments Act 1908). We are seeing demand grow and this may continue as the growth is fuelled by economic and sustainability concerns. However, the identification and provision of land for use as allotments can take some time. Hence, we need to plan in advance.

The economic situation is predicted to continue, in particular, food inflation is expected to rise. Below is a graphic showing the exceptional rise in food inflation in some instances up to 45% has been reported.
